## SIAA Welcomes the Federal Government's Commitment to Australia's Space Future

The Space Industry Association of Australia (SIAA) welcomes the significant commitment made today of more than \$65 million by the Morrison government to further support Australia becoming a launch destination and getting Australian technology into space. SIAA also celebrates the ambitions of the government to have Australian astronauts back in space.

"Australians know how important space is every time they check a satellite weather forecast or turn on navigation in their car. Today's announcements will support the Australian space industry and the booming space economy, it once more draws attention to the fac that Australia is open for space launch services."

"Importantly, the Prime Minister is opening a door for the thousands of Australians who have the skills and ambition to make it as an astronaut and want to help human exploration and industry in space," said SIAA CEO James Brown.

The government's co-investment of \$32 million to develop three new or existing spaceports or launch sites as well as the commitment to support the Australian space industry in ascertaining flight qualification is strong signal of support from the government.
